I am honored to serve this great community and the residents of Pavilion as the Town Supervisor, following some truly hardworking men. I wish to thank former Supervisor Howard for his 6 years of service.

I began as Town Supervisor in January 2018 and at that time, many large tasks and jobs were in the works. Working as a team, this daunting task has gone smoothly. The entire board has worked very hard, well above and beyond the typical duties. A unique twist of appointing a Budget Director has also spread out the workload. Now into late May, we have accomplished pages of crossed off lists. Many of these projects you may find uninteresting but all were insanely imperative to help our town. Most importantly, we have been able to reduce costs throughout the township in multiple areas, including but not limited to auditing and insurance. We have also updated and implemented many policies throughout the town.

Currently, we have some major ongoing projects that I would like to inform you about. We are working on the aging sewer plant, repairing roads (along with expanding the budget in order to repair more roads in our town), sales tax revenue, and the new water tower project (including the county water agreement). In addition, the 2016 & 2017 audits showed favorable results.

I would like to take a moment to thank all of the Town Board Members for their dedication and hard work helping to better our community. Your 2018 Town of Pavilion Town Board members are: Jim Thater, John Rudgers, Don Oberlin, and Mark Heineman. In addition, my Deputy and Budget Director, Rob LaPoint.

A REMINDER FROM THE BUILDING AND ZONING DEPARTMENT ABOUT PROPERTY MAINTENANCE

In an attempt to keep our community beautiful and safe we need to encourage all property owners to do their part in maintaining structures and their exterior premises.

The New York State Property Maintenance Code specifically states that the owner of a property shall be responsible for keeping clean, sanitary, and safe conditions. Some of the conditions which are prohibited are unlicensed or inoperative motor vehicles, excessive overgrown noxious weeds or plant growth, and structures that are in disrepair. Our hope is that by keeping the lines of communication open and addressing these issues which are found in every community, we can begin to eliminate any conditions we find right here in our Town. We are always available to Town residents to address any questions or concerns you may have, or assisting you to keep our community clean and safe. Along with property maintenance we are here at the ready to assist you with any and all upcoming construction projects which require a permit. If you are a contractor, hiring a contractor, or completing the work yourself we are here to assist you and to make the process as easy as possible.

The Pavilion Community Food Pantry

The Community Food Pantry is maybe a little less busy than in past years, with our number of "families served monthly" sinking into the teens. This is good news for all of us: families who are making it on their own, families who still do need help, and our volunteers, who can be run off their feet at times! It also has relieved the financial pressure.

When we put out an SOS in the last newsletter, the response was heart-warming. Not only did we receive rescue donations of money, but a number of groups collected food and brought it to us, stocking our shelves. Then we received word from Foodlink that several companies had made grants available to the school's backpack program that would cover winter deliveries, saving us hundreds of dollars. Next, we discovered that Foodlink has changed the way they distribute funds for the pantries, and a good amount of food that had not been covered prior to this year was now being provided at minimal cost as pool funding. (And I'm learning more about how financing works, to our benefit!)

The good news didn't stop there. Without naming names and embarrassing people who choose to remain anonymous, we received the donation of a brand-new chest freezer from a local family in February; the Methodist Church immediately put in a new electrical outlet and made space available. On the very day it was delivered by Home Depot in March, a local farmer lost a cow in a barn accident and donated the meat, which came to us as nearly 400 pounds of hamburger. The farmer paid the processing costs as well, making these two happy events a major, earth-shaking gift. Now instead of a pound of hamburger per month, whether your family is one person or 12, clients receive a number of packages based on family size. This is a big deal for our larger families. And it saves a significant amount of funds, to boot.

And then came more: Wegman's had a warehouse accident, and (long story short) brought several truckloads of products to a local company, Natural Upcycling. They in turn notified the Pavilion, LeRoy and York Pantries, allowing us to take what we could use and delivering it to us at their own expense. There was a wide variety of items: paper towels, cases of water, bleach and detergent, canned soups, fruit, bottled hot sauce, cereal, snacks foods...the list goes on. Wegman's problem became our good fortune, and that's in a nutshell how the secondary, or reclaimed food network, works best.

Finally, we have applied for and are waiting to hear about grants from Foodlink that will bring us fresh milk coupons and produce in season from local farmers this spring through fall. It's been a busy and happy winter and spring; we have been well blessed by a multitude of generous people, farms, and companies. Our heartfelt thanks to everyone who recognizes our needs and answers our calls.

SENATOR RANZENHOFER SECURES \$325,000 FOR NEW WATER STORAGE TANK

State Sen. Michael H. Ranzenhofer announced on May 9th that the state has awarded \$325,000 for a Water Storage Tank Improvement Project in the Town of Pavilion.

The project involves replacing and relocating an existing water storage tank that has deteriorated beyond repair. The new water storage tank will have an estimated capacity of approximately 300,000 gallons. It will be located on York Road.

"Clean drinking water isn't a luxury for our families, it's essential. I am pleased to secure state funding to ensure safe drinking water for residents in the Town of Pavilion. This landmark investment will make it possible to extend water services to over 200 households that don't have access now," said Ranzenhofer.

Town Supervisor Dean Davis said, "Senator Ranzenhofer is working to make water service possible for many homes desperately in need of a safe, reliable water supply, and this state funding will help to make our Town's water improvement project a reality," said Town of Pavilion Supervisor Dean Davis."


